



plant selections, plant replacement, and editing. There is not much space for new plants in the garden, but there is always an opening or two. We added several plants which would have been available and used during Frances Willard's time. We also replaced some modern cultivars with heirloom varieties, such as Rhododendron "Amoenum" and Clematis "Madame Eduard Andre." In editing the beds, we moved some plants due to spacing or light requirements. This is the first year we had to divide plants to give away. We donated them to the Lincolnwood Garden Club of Evanston for their Garden Fair plant sale. The sale raises money for nonprofit grants, which we have received twice.
